

LIST of MAJOR BUILDINGS/STOPS on NORTH SHORE TOUR

1) **Evanston Public Library**/Church & Orrington Streets

architect: Joseph Powell (design); Nagle, Hartray & Assoc. (architect of record)

date: 1994

comments:

- inspired by Prairie School (reminiscent of at least two FL Wright buildings)
- possesses a number of interesting arts works

2) **Levere Memorial Tmepole of SAE**/ 1856 N. Sheridan Rd

architect: Arthur Knox

date: 1930

comments:

- expensive, elaborately decorated building serves as SAE national hq.
- most notable aspect is Tiffany windows in Chapel

3) **Charles Gates Dawes House**/ 225 Greenwood St.

architect: Henry Edwards-Ficken

date: 1895

comments:

- built for Robert Sheppard, business mgr of Northwestern University
- sold to Dawes in 1909
- style is French Chateau (Francois I of 15th century); 28 rooms
- used in filming the movie *Road to Perdition* with Tom Hanks and Paul Newman

5) **Mary & Leigh Block Museum of Art & Sculpture Garden**/ Northwestern Univ.

architects: Loeb, Schlossman & Hackl; Lohan & Associates

dates: 1980; 2000

comments:

- though there is a permanent collection (mostly prints & drawings), most of the exhibitions are temporary
- current exhibition is *The Brilliant Line* (on engraving, 1480-1650, which we'll see only if weather prevents us from touring sculpture garden)

6) **Bahai House of Worship (or Bahai Temple)**/ Linden at Sheridan Road in Wilmette

architect: Louis Bourgeois (and Alfred Shaw)

date: design: 1917; completion date: 1953

comments:

- first Bahai house of worship in Western world
- 9-sided building clad with unusual concrete panels (quartz and white cement)
- on National Register of Historic Places
